Ensuring the stability of services and strengthening the role of communities in the area of HIV policy

- 1. Development and adoption of national strategies for sustainable services in the field of HIV and TB with an action plan to ensure sustainability
- 2. Funding programs for vulnerable groups and PLHIV from local budgets social order (Poltava and Odessa region)
- 3. National communities platform, initiated by UNAIDS: leaders of all the key groups working together!
- 4. Regional Community Council consultative bodies at local communities.



Ensuring the stability of services and strengthening the role of communities in the area of HIV policy (2)

- 5. Increasing the representation of vulnerable groups (PWUD, MSM, sex workers) to:
- the State Coordinating Committee (CCM) on HIV / AIDS and TB responses;
- permanent committees and working groups at the Ministry of Health and the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine (the Program Committee, Committee on Regional Policy, Commission for the Supervision of Global Fund grants).

- 7. Services support for vulnerable groups and advocacy programs for the transition to state / local funding during the transition period.
- 8. Experience exchange between experts representing different countries; implementation of the constituent element exchanges and study visits to explore best practices in advocacy projects implemented by NGOs in Ukraine.



What should AAE's role be to support advocacy and how passive, active or proactive should AAE be when it comes to advocacy at national level?



AAE role, as one of the leading networks in support of advocacy work

- The role of advisory and training (regional consultations, trainings on advocacy and leadership for the leaders of the vulnerable communities);
- Increasing of the fundraising capacity of NGOs, in the first place community-oriented ones, assistance in obtaining financing for an implementation of advocacy programs;



AAE role in supporting advocacy work (2)

Providing technical support for the community (development of instruments and policies that increase the capacity and organizational development of NGOs and others);

Experience exchange between experts, study visits abroad (successful practices with the state in the implementation of health and social programs for vulnerable groups).




The results of the national advocacy on HIV / AIDS treatment, OST and hepatitis C in 2016 - the All-Ukrainian Network of PLWH


MPP expanded its license on dolutegravir and included Ukraine
