
End Inequalities. End AIDS. Global AIDS Strategy 2021-2026

In line with SDGs, 2025 targets and vision of Three Zeros

Strategic priorities with result areas:

- Maximize equitable and equal access to HIV services and solutions
- Break down barriers to achieving HIV outcomes
- Fully resource and sustain efficient HIV responses and integrate them into systems for health, social protection, humanitarian settings and pandemic responses

2025 HIV targets and commitments

95 targets:

- Combination prevention
- Treatment targets
- Women access SRHR services
- Service coverage eliminating vertical transmission

90 targets:

- PLHIV receiving TB preventive treatment
- Linkage to integrated health services

10 targets:

- Stigma and discrimination
- Gender based inequalities and GBV
- Punitive laws and policies

Regional profiles – Eastern Europe and Central Asia

Regional priority actions:

- Urgently expand access to combination HIV prevention
- Close gaps in the testing and treatment
- Institutionalize community-led services into national health care and HIV prevention systems
- Remove discriminatory and punitive laws, policies and structural barriers
- Transform harmful gender norms and reduce gender-based violence





Regional profiles – Western and Central Europe and North America – part 1

Regional priority actions:

- Increase domestic financing
- Develop and implement national plans
- Improve testing strategies
- Expand HIV prevention services, including PrEP and harm reduction.
- Improve quality of life of people living with HIV by overcoming stigma and discrimination in health care services
- Provide universal access for all, including key populations and migrants, to stigma- free quality HIV prevention, treatment and care services





Regional profiles – Western and Central Europe and North America – part 2

Regional priority actions (continued)

- Provide equal access to and the continuation of HIV prevention, treatment and care services for people in closed settings
- Provide equal access to and the continuation of HIV prevention, treatment and care services for people in closed settings
- Remove legal, regulatory and financial barriers
- Remove punitive and discriminatory laws and policies
- Increase community engagement and leadership in local responses
- Improve the quality and timeliness of data collection, reporting and use
- Increase investments in HIV research





MAJOR OPPOSITION AND ISSUES

- "Red flags" for member states in the strategy:
 - Human rights (right to health, right to prevention treatment, SRHR etc.)
 - Key populations named and listed
 - Civil society role of, definition of, and funding for
- Broader context:
 - Limiting UNAIDS mandate to HIV i.e. not human rights
 - Push to keep gender binary
 - Make certain key populations disappear in national context
 - Challenging processes at PCB, place of CS at the table





ADVOCACY POINTS AND OPPORTUNITIES

- Strong and progressive strategy
 - needs welcoming and applauding
 - Broad sign up by member states
 - Focus on adequate funding: UBRAF, GFATM, national programmes, civil society
- UNAIDS PCB Special session March 24-25 (Pre-meetings from March 9)
 - Register as observing NGO Friday March 5th 6pm CET
- UNGA High Level Meeting on HIV/AIDS June 8-10, 2021
 - Civil society participation
 - Advocacy at national level: broad signing up for strategy
