- 1 in 2 people are diagnosed late

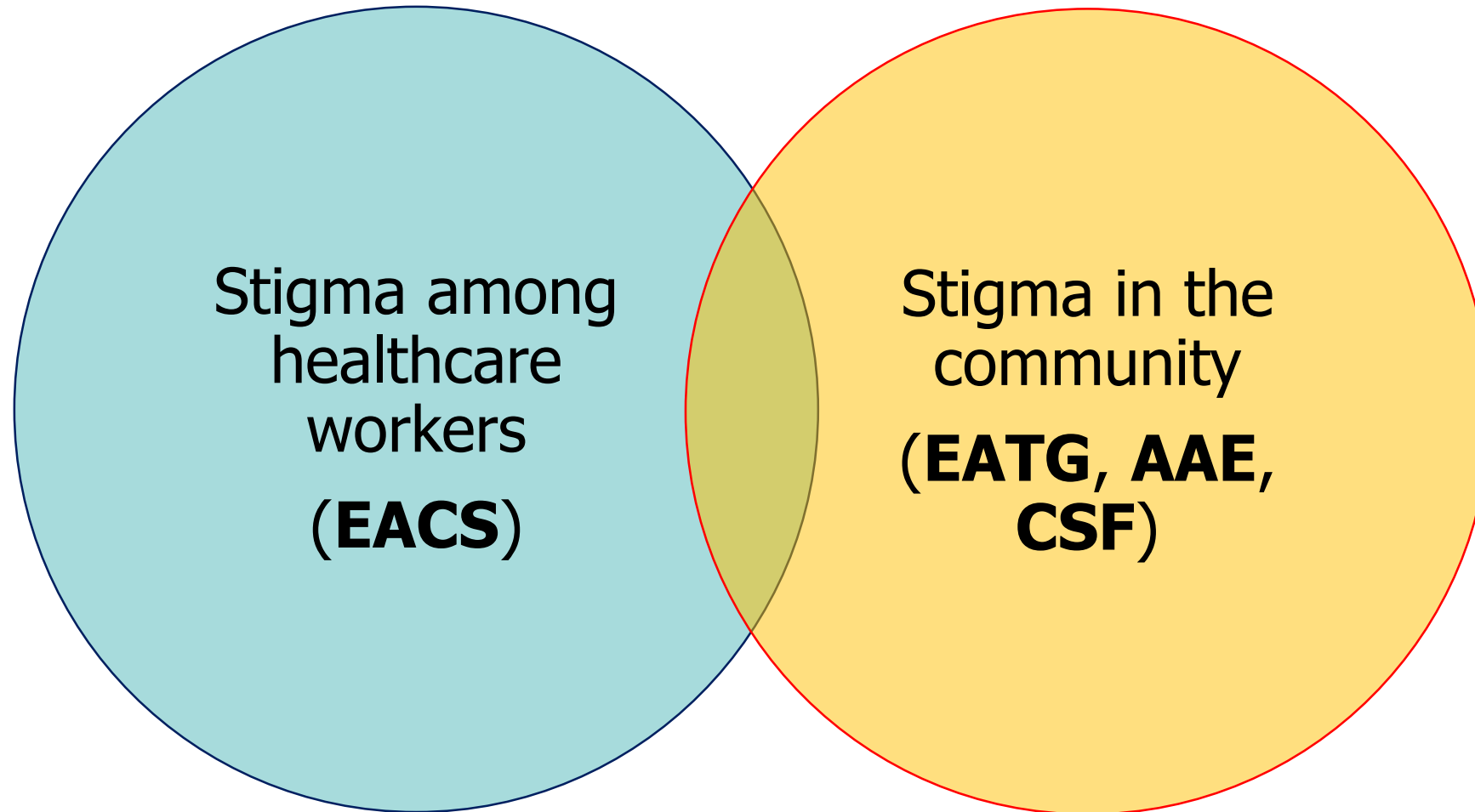

- Meaningful to advance our understanding of stigma and discrimination

- Replicable (e.g. 2021, 2025, 2030)
 - Aim is to show any progress over the 10 years that are left before 2030
