
What countries commit to & how we support

Country Commitments


- 1) Partner with CSOs, people being left behind, UN, donors to identify policy & programme gaps, design & implement evidence-informed interventions, and track progress in eliminating HIV-related stigma & discrimination.
- 2) Assess current state of HIV-related stigma & discrimination to identify & implement programmes to eliminate barriers to services
- 3) Take actions on eliminating HIV-related stigma & discrimination in six settings over 5 years; commit to 3 settings in first year
- 4) Allocate resources to support implementation, monitoring & reporting of interventions to eliminate HIV-related stigma & discrimination
- Monitor and report annually on progress using existing and recommended indicators
















Impact on the ground



Catalytic Technical Support: Regional and country coordinators accelerate the implementation of (and advocacy around) the GP to achieve the societal enablers targets leading to:

- Targeted Synergies: Alignment with existing grants/processes ensuring available resources for human rights and societal enablers programming
 - CCMs tasked with implementation in PNG, Thailand, South Africa, Uganda...
 - Synergy with GFATM, PEPFAR & UNAIDS focal country collaboration on pushing S&D action in select countries

Strong collaboration at regional and national level:

- Shared experiences and knowledge led to streamlined processes/models of national action plans in 6 countries
 - Jamaica: multisectoral and high-level commitment led to operational plan to remove HIV-related human rights barriers and M&E model and score card

Knowledge Hub & Communities of Practice

- Launch of country coordinator meetings to share experiences, good practices & lessons learned
 - Regional dialogues to be piloted further to reinforce capacities of implementers, share best practices & identify opportunities for collaboration

Impact on the ground continued



Guided Implementation:

- Supported initiatives to address human rights & gender-related barriers through technical support in 7 countries.
- Ukraine: technical support to GP implementing bodies on legal reform, e.g. reviewing the HIV Law and decriminalizing HIV transmission
- * M&E framework in development and systematic review of programmes to address intersectional discrimination

Capacitated Actors

- ❖ Iran: health workers trained in ensuring accessible HIV services in emergency settings
- v Uganda: healthcare workers trained on human rights-based approaches to HIV & SRHR services

Advocacy and legal support

- v Uganda: advocacy for the Head of State not to assent anti LGBTQ bill
- v Ghana: Support to LGBTQI coalition in drafting memorandum highlighting the damaging impact of proposed anti LGBTQ+ Bill
- v Moldova, Ukraine, Tadjikistan actualization of HIV decrim in EECA

Impact on the ground continued




- Mechanisms addressing human right violations in place
 - Thailand: National Code of Conduct on HIV prevention & management in workplace
 - * Kazakhstan: website for data collection on real-time human rights violations of PLHIV & KPs
 - ❖ Jamaica: M&E online platform tracking progress in eliminating S&D, Human Rights Scorecard to improve complementarity, coherence, & accountability of interventions
- Improved Legal & Enabling Environments: adoption of enabling policies and/or advocacy for repealing discriminatory ones
 - CAR's National Charter for Quality of Care and Patients' Rights
 - Iran's anti-discrimination bylaw for healthcare settings
- Capacitated Advocates: Communities meaningfully engaging with national/intl entities for their rights, advocating for policy & law reform, and securing political commitment
 - Senegal: #MoreThan campaign adapted locally to challenge stereotypes towards PLHIV
 - Kazakhstan: ties established between Parliamentary members & PLHIV community to facilitate advocacy around repeal of discriminatory laws
 - RedTraSex advocacy: mobilized Argentina to join GP and secured high-level political commitment for the GP in Costa Rica

Partnering with Communities to challenge stigma & discrimination

#MoreThan anti-stigma advocacy campaign

- Community-led and partnership based: UN agencies & civil society
- Education & advocacy tool and political leverage to garner more support (country, donor, partner) and momentum. Global webinars (9) as additional learning tools for implementation
- Leverages key intl days to highlight setting-specific interventions, rights violations and best practices in all settings & for particularly affected groups (10 global campaigns & 16 countries with antistigma advocacy campaigns connected to the GP)
- 2022: regional & country level targeting to ensure **strategic advocacy** on the ground, e.g. discriminatory law reform
