What?

Stakeholders in viral hepatitis, representing **patients** and **community**, **clinicians** and **researchers**, come together to speak with **one voice**, to **advocate** at EU and national level for **viral hepatitis elimination** in Europe.

Why?

The 2016 WHO Global Strategy and the WHO Europe Action Plan set the elimination goal for hepatitis by 2030, but many Member States do not appear to have the fight against viral hepatitis on their radar screen. ACHIEVE aims to create a **political urgency at EU and national level** to ensure that the **WHO goal** will be met.

ACHIEVE ASKED TO SPEAK ABOUT THE ROLE OF PARTNERSHIPS

Tbilisi, Georgia, 11-13 February 2019

- The aim of the consultation was to assess progress on the road to eliminating viral hepatitis by 2030
- Participants included
 - o 45 Member States representatives from the WHO European Region
 - Epidemiological experts
 - Civil society organisations
 - Patients' associations
- Evidence showed that viral hepatitis mortality has not yet decreased
- Participants agreed that to achieve elimination goals in time we need to:
 - Ensure universal health coverage
 - Target **vulnerable populations** (such as drug users, prisoners and migrants)
 - o Address the social determinants of viral hepatitis

Good practice compendium	Collect existing good practice at national and local level to demonstrate that elimination can be done

EU outreach	Reach out to new policymakers in Commission and Parliament to ensure hepatitis elimination is included on the agenda of the new legislature
